The Buccaneers TV Series Trailer

Apple TV+ has released the first trailer for its upcoming period drama *The Buccaneers*. Based on Edith Wharton's unfinished final novel of the same name, the eight-episode series follows a group of young American heiresses who descend upon tightly corseted London society in the 1870s to secure husbands and titles, igniting a culture clash and budding romances along the way.

The series was created by Katherine Jakeways and directed by Susanna White. It stars Kristine Froseth as Nan St. George, Alisha Boe as Conchita Closson, Josie Totah as Mabel Elmsworth, Aubri Ibrag as Lizzy Elmsworth, Imogen Waterhouse as Jinny St. George, and Christina Hendricks as Mrs. St. George. The ensemble is rounded out by Mia Threapleton, Josh Dylan, Guy Remmers, Matthew Broome, and Barney Fishwick. It is produced by the all-female creative team at The Forge Entertainment.

Trailer Summary

The gang of girls - referred to as "the 'Booty' girls" in the trailer - is sent by their wealthy families to England for the "London Season," a time of elite socializing and ball-dancing in which they hope to secure a suitable husband and title. While the heiresses make a splash in their new surroundings, it's soon clear that their hearts are set on much more than a man and a fancy house.

As the women one-by-one snag rich English husbands, they quickly find that married life is not all that it's cracked up to be. The aristocratic world of the

British upper class is filled with misery, sadness, affairs, illness, and more. But the 'Booty' girls are determined to find their happily ever after, no matter the cost.

The movie's beautiful cinematography and costumes help to elevate the story, as does the excellent cast. But the film's story is too melodramatic and overly sentimental, and it fails to engage the viewer emotionally. It is still a fun watch, and a great way to see Yul Brynner in a non-action role. Olive Films' Blu-ray restoration of this VistaVision production looks spectacular and features a rousing music score by Elmer Bernstein. This is a must-see for fans of classic Hollywood cinema.

The Buccaneer's Release Date

If you're looking to see the new Buccaneers TV show, it will air globally on November 8 with episodes released weekly through December 13. This is Apple's first traditional costume drama and it looks like it'll be worth a look.

The eight-episode series, inspired by Pulitzer Prize winner Edith Wharton's final unfinished novel of the same name, will star Kristine Froseth as Nan St. George, a spirited American who bursts into the strictly formal London scene of the 1870s and reignites an Anglo-American cultural tussle. Kristine Froseth's character is a yearning, beautiful soul whose sense of adventure trumps all other concerns in her life. The rest of the ensemble cast is led by Critics Choice Award nominee Josie Totah as Mabel Elmsworth, Alisha Boe as Conchita Closson, AVAWAVES member Miya Folic as Lizzy Elmsworth, and Imogen Waterhouse as Jinny St. George.

While the series' production took place primarily in the United Kingdom, it will also feature extensive filming in Spain and France. Its lush, lavish set design will be courtesy of the team behind *Downton Abbey*. The new *Buccaneers* was developed by writer Katherine Jakeways and directed by BAFTA Award winner Susanna White. Both serve as executive producers alongside Beth Willis.

Release Date

The edgy trailer for the new *Buccaneers* was released on Wednesday (Oct. 4) and features an angsty track from Olivia Rodrigo. It's an ominous preview of the series, which will air on Nov. 8.

In addition to showcasing the rich costumes of this period drama, the edgy trailer also showcases the tumultuous relationships between the characters. The new series is sure to be a sexy, scandalous ride.

The *Buccaneers* is a fresh take on historical fiction that features the story of five young American women and their journey into high society in Victorian England. It has already been compared to Netflix's hit period drama *Bridgerton*, which has inspired a Regency romance boom and even spawned a spinoff prequel. do.”

Playing the matriarch of the group is *Mad Men* and *Drive* star Christina Hendricks as Mrs. St. George, Nan’s mother. She’s the belle of the ball – until her daughters Nan and Jinny prove that money can’t buy everything, even in the land of high society.

The Buccaneers is directed by BAFTA-award winner Susanna White, with series creator Katherine Jakeways serving as writer. The cast also includes Josie Totah (*Mabel Elmsworth*), Alisha Boe (*Conchita Closson*), Aubri Ibrag (*Lizzy Elmsworth*), Mia Threapleton (*Honoraria Marable*) and Imogen Waterhouse (*Jinny St. George*). Josh Dylan and Guy Remmers also appear in the cast, as Lord Richard Marable, Theo, Duke of Tintagel and Matthew Broome as Guy Thwarte.

The Buccaneers Storyline

The Buccaneers is a new period drama set in Victorian London. The show is based on Edith Wharton’s unfinished novel of the same name and will premiere on November 8 on Apple TV+. It stars *Sharp Stick* actress Kristine Froseth, *13 Reasons Why* alum Alisha Boe and *Saved By the Bell* star Josie Totah. The show is created and directed by an all-female creative team, with series creator Katherine Jakeways and BAFTA-Award winner Susanna White serving as executive producers.

The Buccaneers Apple TV+ Plot Summary

The show takes place in the late 19th century, following a group of American debutantes who travel to London hoping to find wealthy English husbands. The daughters of America’s nouveau riche – who gained their wealth through entrepreneurial endeavors rather than old-money inheritance – are desperate for respectability and social status in the eyes of England’s aristocrats.

But the girls’ scheming and manipulations often backfire, and they find themselves caught in a web of deceit, revenge, and betrayal. Ultimately, the story of *The Buccaneers* is about the girls’ struggle between modernity and tradition,

conformity and rebellion.

Though Wharton died before completing the novel, Viking published three-fifths of the manuscript in 1938, with a sketch of her intended conclusion. Later, Maggie Wadey wrote the screenplay for a 1993 TV miniseries, which was filmed in the United States and starred Carla Gugino, Mira Sorvino, Rya Kihlsted, Alison Elliott, and Michael Culin.

While the miniseries had its moments, it largely drew on Wharton's themes without really capturing her spirit or energy. As a result, the characters seemed self-consciously posed and mockingly staged, and the pirate action was rudimentary at best.
